Covid-19 Risk Assessment

Covid-19 is a new illness that can affect a peso lungs and airways. It is caused by a virus called Coronavirus. Symptoms can be mild, moderate, severe or fatal.

Legislation¹ under the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005 requires health surveillance to be carried out based on risk assessment. Employers are required to undertake a risk assessment with regard to Covid-19 and potential workplace exposure where the nature of work poses an occupational exposure health risk to Covid-19.

This risk assessment is designed to identify suitable control measures to mitigate the risk of Covid-19 infection. Risk assessments need to be regularly reviewed and updated and be based on the current best practice in relation to infection prevention and control.

What is the risk?

Spread of Covid-19 Coronavirus

Key Challenge: A key challenges for schools during this pandemic is to balance the need for a practical and sensible level of caution with the need to provide a supportive environment for students/students and where teachers feel able to engage with students in a way that supports their learning.

Transmission: Being a respiratory virus, Covid-19 is transmitted through respiratory droplets, with person-to-person contact appearing to be the main method of transmission. The virus can also survive on contaminated surfaces, possibly for up to several days. Both symptomatic and asymptomatic transmission (when a person is displaying no symptoms) occurs.

Covid-19 - Primary Symptoms: Fever (higher temperature of 38 degrees C. (100.4 degrees F.) or above - Cough which can be any kind of cough, not just a dry cough - shortness of breath or breathing difficulties - loss of smell, of taste or distortion of taste

Human Health Risk: mild, moderate, severe or fatal. Older adults, or those with underlying medical conditions appear to be at a higher risk of developing more serious complications from Covid-19 illness.

This Risk Assessment has been prepared in response to the emerging risks associated with Covid-19 pandemic.

Note: Staff, parents and students (as age appropriate) should understanding the benefits and risks of education and social interaction and that it is not possible to guarantee that infection can be prevented in any setting either in an education centre, at home or in any other setting where people interact with other people.

Risk of Covid-19 spreading in the School environment	 The risk is of spread of infection exists in all interpersonal interactions such as student-student, teacher -teacher, and teacher-student and is not limited to the classroom and requires to be managed in all settings within Galway Educate Together Secondary School. - Encouraging good hand hygiene technique, respiratory hygiene and social distancing
- Creation of a contact tracing log
- Plan in place for how to deal with a suspected case
- Provision of Covid-19 presentations for staff, students, parents and guardians.
- Prohibiting of social physical contact, no hand to hand greetings / hugs.
- Promotion of awareness of Covid-19 and it's symptoms32 among staff, parents / guardians and students with age appropriate posters, email/text communications
- All staff and students to wear face mask except where exemption exists for students with learning needs identified in the DES guidance. Medical grade masks in the EN16483 category to be provided for SNA's.
- Heightened awareness by staff, parents / guardians and children (age appropriate) on how to protect themselves and each other as well as how to recognise and report symptoms of Covid-19 infection
- New guidance from DES on ventilation requires windows to be as open as possible in rooms when not in use and also at the end of the school day and partially open when the room is in
- The exclusion of staff, student, visitors and contractors who are
- Requirement that staff/students who experience symptoms of Covid-19 or other acute infectious disease are not to attend school, to phone their doctor and to follow HSE guidance on self-isolation.
- Requirement that staff members are not to present for work if they have been identified by HSE as a Contact of a person with Covid-19 and to follow the HSE advice on restriction of movement.
- Requirement that staff members / students who develop symptoms at school to bring this to the attention of their teacher / SNA promptly and to follow HSE guidance on selfisolation
- Advice to parents not to bring their children to school if the child has symptoms of a viral respiratory infection or if there is someone in the household suspected or known to have Covid-19
- Advice to parents not to bring their children to school if they have been identified as Covid-19 contacts

Risk of Covid-19 spreading in the School environment

- Advice to parents that the school reserves the right to decline entry to students who appear to have fever or respiratory tract infection.
- Ensuring students (as appropriate) are aware of the reason why they should not attend if they have respiratory symptoms.
- Ensure students are aware that if they develop signs or symptoms of Covid-19 when at school to let their teacher know
- Ensuring everyone who entering the school / classroom performs hand hygiene with a hand sanitiser.
- Teachers required to maintain a minimum of 1m distance and where possible 2m when dealing with students.
- Teachers taking measures to avoid close contact at face to face level such as remaining standing rather than sitting beside/crouching down
- Class space reconfigured to maximise physical distancing (where possible)
- Avoidance of situations that require people to sit or stand in direct physical contact with other people is to be avoided.
- Where students need to move about within the classroom to perform activities (for example to access a shared resource) this is to be organised to the greatest extent possible so as to minimise congregation around the point of access to the shared resource.
- Students and teachers are to avoid sharing of personal items such as pens and other writing materials, tablets and phones to the greatest extent possible.
- All teachers, other staff and students are to avoid behaviours that involve hand to mouth contact (putting pens/pencils in the mouth etc.)
- Where teaching and learning involves use of keyboards or tablets the contact surfaces of the devices are cleaned by user before use and when finished with the keyboard or device and hand hygiene to be encouraged.
- Where teaching and learning involves use of whiteboards the contact surfaces of the board are cleaned by user before use and when finished.
- In the event of sub-groups being required within a class for group work, to the greatest extent possible the same students will generally be in the same group, although movement between groups may be necessary in the event it is necessary to address tensions between students.
- Students will remain in base classroom and teachers will move between rooms
- When students have to move to an option subject they are required to move quickly into the new class and are required to be seated with members of their class cohort, observing as much physical distancing as possible.

Risk of Covid-19 spreading in the School environment

- Hand washing and/or sanitising and/or desk wipe down is required when moving between classes by both teacher and students.
- Students and Teachers required to maintain 2 metres physical distance outside of classroom
- Request for social distancing requirements between people congregating at school gates
- Students required to go straight to their classroom upon arrival
- Physical distancing of 2 metres requirements between staff members within the staff room and when not engaged in teaching.
- Implementation of a 'No Hand shaking policy'.
- Requirement to avoid gathering within the school at the beginning or end of the school day.
- Protocol in place in the event a student or teacher should develop symptoms of Covid-19 during the school day.
- Communication of risks to teachers, staff, students, parents / guardians.
- Advice to teachers, staff, students, parents / guardians of the need to stay at home if showing symptoms of Covid-19 or if in contact with other with symptoms of Covid-19
- Regular cleaning and sanitiser of workplace and communal equipment
- Use of PPE (gloves/masks) provided when dealing with and isolating Covid-19 suspected symptomatic person.
- Sanitisation of shared equipment/ areas.
- Increased cleaning and disinfecting of high-risk objects and surfaces schedule, such as door handles, handrails, light switches, reception area, toilets, communal areas etc.
- Appointment of Covid-19 Lead Worker representative(s).
- Students will be zoned at breaktimes
- Assemblies within the school have been cancelled. Where assemblies are necessary, they will be implemented through individual base classes or live streaming into base classes.
- Meetings are conducted online in place of face to face meetings where applicable / possible.
- Where face to face meetings are absolutely necessary, the length of the meeting and the numbers attending the meeting are kept to a minimum. These meetings will be made on an appointment basis only.
- Requirement to walk / pass on the right-hand side corridors within the school to aid traffic flow and avoid contact with others

Risk of Covid-19 spreading in the School environment

Informal gatherings on corridors / stairs / when entering, moving about or exiting the school are prohibited Unnecessary gatherings of staff at the beginning and termination of the school's day Students allocated designated work / desk area, with the exception of when they are required to move classes in relation to subject choices Classrooms have been reconfigured to maximise physical distancing and lockers have been removed Social distancing of 1m has been implemented in classrooms, so the wearing of face coverings is compulsory Visitors are required to make an appointment prior to visiting the school Staff have been instructed to observe social distancing requirement when using the staff room. Employees are required to clean and sanitise their workstations / areas at the commencement and at the termination periods of their working day / period / area including equipment, etc. All official business trips and face-to-face interactions been reduced to the absolute minimum Flushing of the school water systems has taken place to prevent any potential for Legionnaires' disease Additional equipment has been installed in the school to aid in the prevention of the spread of Covid-19. Additional hand sanitising stations and signage has been included in our new prefabs rooms. New procedures for ensuring social distancing in prefabs have been created and explained to staff and students, this involves students waiting outside downstairs rather than crowding on the stairs. Good communication required between LS5 and LS6 and LS2 and LS3 required at the change over of lessons, breaktimes and lunchtimes, end of day to ensure one room is let out first, this will avoid overcrowding. Presence of Senior Management at these times to help assist. One group waits on one path and the other on the opposite path. Wearing of Non-medical masks – The wearing of non-medical Risk of Covid-19 to masks may reduce the transmission of Covid-19 from vulnerable high-risk individuals who may be infected with Covid-19 virus (i.e. persons asymptomatic) and are therefore compulsory where a 2m physical distancing is not achievable Some remote teaching learning facilities may be implemented

in the event of a student(s) self-isolating at home

Students with Special Educational Needs	 Arrangements in place with parents/guardians regarding the necessity for highlighting awareness of signs, symptoms or changes which might suggest illness / Covid-19 infections so as to ensure students do not attend school where symptoms are present. Assistance with hand hygiene for students who may be unable to wash their hands themselves. Cleaning student's aids and appliance and/ or medical equipment etc. Teachers and staff using facial coverings / face visors and other required PPE equipment in circumstances where physical distancing is not possible. Teachers and staff performing regular hand hygiene when working between different students.
Working at Home of Vulnerable / High Risk Students	 Arrangements in place with parents/guardians regarding the necessity for highlighting awareness of signs, symptoms or changes which might suggest illness / Covid-19 infections so as to ensure students do not attend school where symptoms are present.
