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ETHICAL EDUCATION

- Specific to Educate Together schools
- 1 lesson per week.



- Involves exploring different worldviews and beliefs, considering ethical dilemmas and the process of ethical decision making (deciding between right and wrong).




GENERAL HOUSE KEEPING
